REGISTRATION POLICIES

- Registration Fee for each camp is a one-time, non-refundable fee (\$25 for residents, \$45 for non-residents). This fee includes one t-shirt, participant insurance, and administrative processing fees.
- Proof of Sunny Isles Beach residency is required in order to receive resident pricing. This must be a utility bill (i.e. electricity, phone, or cable. Cell phone bill is NOT acceptable.). Participant must be a year-round resident of Sunny Isles Beach OR parent/legal guardian must own/lease in Sunny Isles Beach.
- The registration form, the non-refundable registration fee, and a 33% (1/3) deposit of camp fees are required for camp enrollment.
- The balance of camp fees will be due in two parts. See Payment and Refund Policies for details (below).
- All camps have limited space available. Once a camp is full, a waiting list (see below for policy) will be started for that camp.
- There are discounts available for early payment (no sibling discounts). Please see below for more information.
- Financial assistance with camp fees is available. *To be considered for financial assistance, you must be a resident and your total household annual income must be less than \$40,000.* If you meet these requirements and are interested in applying, please fill out the application form (available at Cultural & Human Services office) and return, along with a copy of your 2009 IRS income tax return by May 1st. **(In order to hold your child's space in camp, you must register your child and pay the registration fee, along with 10% of the camp fees).** Financial assistance is only available for general day camps, not specialty camps (i.e. financial assistance will not be applied to Junior Lifeguard Camp, Specialty Half-Day Camps, or Sports Camps).

DISCOUNTS AVAILABLE

- **Early Payment Discount:** If you enroll your child in any camp and choose to pay the full amount due by 8:00PM on May 15th, you will receive a discount off your total camp fees (**10% discount for residents, 5% discount for non-residents**).

*** Please note that the sibling discount is NO LONGER AVAILABLE.*

WAITLIST POLICY

Once any week becomes full, a waitlist will be started for that week. Anyone interested in having their name placed on the waitlist, must fill out a waitlist form (this will be a short form with basic information about the potential participant as well as the parent or guardian). Interested participants will have the following priority on the waitlist:

- 1st Priority: Enrolled Participants (Children who are already enrolled in another week of the camp.)
- 2nd Priority: Residents
- 3rd Priority: Non-residents

PAYMENT, REFUND & CANCELLATION POLICIES

- Registration Fee for any camp is a one-time, non-refundable fee (\$25 for residents, \$45 for non-residents). If you are registering for more than one camp, you must pay the full registration fee for the first camp. For each additional camp, you will receive a discount of \$10 off the registration fee.
- Payments will be due in three parts: 1/3 at the time of registration, 1/3 due on May 15th, and the final 1/3 due on June 5th. **ALL CAMP FEES ARE DUE PRIOR TO THE START OF THE SUMMER.**
- There are no grace periods on payments. If a payment is not received by due date, your reservation may be lost, and your deposit will NOT be refunded.
- Refunds of camp fees (minus CANCELLATION FEE) can be made **ONLY IF** reservation is cancelled (in writing) with at least 14 days notice to the Cultural & Human Services office. A CANCELLATION FEE of \$20 per week will be applied for ANY and ALL summer camp cancellations. Please understand that there is extensive administrative work involved in processing and cancelling your child's enrollment.

*Swim test for Elite Squad will take place on Saturday, April 17th @ 10:00am
(Parent must be present to sign waiver for swim test)

Participants must be able to:

- * Swim 100 yards with a steady stroke under 2 minutes (without stopping)
- * Swim 30 feet underwater without stopping
- * Tread water for 3 minutes

This camp is organized and run by certified Sunny Isles Beach lifeguards. Campers learn basic skills of lifeguarding, including first aid, CPR, ocean safety, and rescue techniques. Campers will spend more than 75% of each day outside, in the sun. Campers should bring their swimsuit, a towel, a change of clothes, plenty of sunscreen, a cap/hat, a water bottle, and a bag lunch every day. Enrollment is limited to 40 campers per week (two groups of 20; Group A at Samson Oceanfront Park and Group B at Pier Park)! **PARTICIPANTS CAN ONLY ENROLL IN ONE SESSION OF THE JUNIOR LIFEGUARD CAMP.**



Requirements: CAMPERS MUST ALREADY KNOW HOW TO SWIM! THIS IS NOT A SWIMMING COURSE! Campers must be able to endure strenuous activity, (there is a great deal of running and swimming outdoors). If your child has any medical conditions, (e.g. heart problems, diabetes, asthma), you must get clearance from your child's doctor before registering for the program.

During this course, students will gain understanding in color mixing and master the basic principles of art. Participants must bring their own lunch everyday. Enrollment is limited to 20 campers.



DANCE Camp (Ballroom and Hip-Hop)

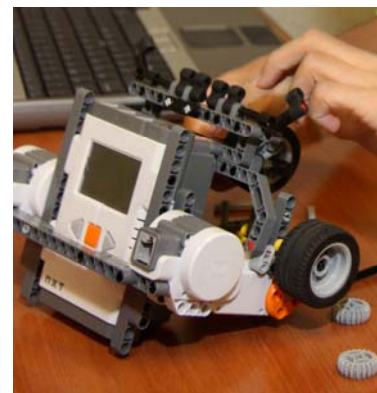
LEGO ROBOTICS Camp

Ages: 6-12

This exciting program teaches participants a hands-on approach to Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math. Participants will use specialized Lego pieces to build robots and program them to follow various instructions and commands. Participants must bring their own lunch everyday. Enrollment is limited to 24 campers.



Specialty Sports Camps

These camps are also day camps, but focus on a particular sport. Although participants do not need to have prior experience in the sport, the participant should be prepared to spend the majority of each camp day (more than 75%) focused on learning the skills of that sport. For soccer and baseball, this means spending the majority of each camp day outdoors. Financial Assistance is NOT available for these camps.

CAMPS

Please note the following changes this summer to our summer camp programs:

- CAMP SIB will be divided into two separate age groups (Juniors & Seniors) in order to provide more age appropriate activities and field-trips.
- CAMP SIB will now be going on TWO field trips per week, instead of THREE, in order to provide more time for creative and varied activities at camp.
- CAMP ADVENTURE will now be going on FOUR field trips most weeks, instead of THREE.
- JUNIOR LIFEGUARD CAMP will now be 2-week sessions, in order to provide more time for instruction to the participants. In addition, we will have two groups running simultaneously (one at Samson Oceanfront Park and one at Pier Park). Interested participants also have an opportunity to test for our Elite Squad, who will participate in competitions against other Junior Lifeguard programs in the surrounding areas.
- NEW CAMPS! NEW CAMPS! - For the first time, the City of Sunny Isles Beach is proud to present various specialty camps, including Fine Art, Dance, and Lego Robotics. Interested participants will receive intensive instruction in those applied areas.

REGISTRATION

A deposit of 1/3 will be due at the time of registration. Session fees will still be made in three equal payments, but all fees will be due in full prior to the start of the summer (final payment day is June 5th).

DISCOUNTS

Sibling discounts are no longer available. Only full payment discounts are available (see page 3).

CANCELLATION FEES!

A cancellation fee will be applied to any cancellations. Weekly fees will be refunded (minus the cancellation fee of \$20 per week), ONLY IF we receive a notice in writing at least 14 days in advance. Changes in enrollment (i.e. cancelling one week, to add another) will still be assessed a cancellation fee of \$20/week.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Residents can apply for financial assistance by providing the application form, along with a copy of their 2009 IRS Tax Return by May 1st. PLEASE NOTE that financial assistance will only be applied to general day camps. Specialty Camps (Junior Lifeguard, Art, Dance, Lego Robotics, and Sports Camps) are not eligible for financial assistance.
