Sixty years ago, an organization was created by President Eisenhower during a White House summit on citizen diplomacy. By establishing Sister Cities International (SCI), he envisioned a network that would be a champion for peace and prosperity by fostering bonds between people from different communities around the world. By forming these relationships, the President reasoned that people from different cultures could understand, appreciate, and celebrate their differences while building partnerships that would lessen the chance of new conflicts.

Here in Sunny Isles Beach, we have embraced the ethos of creating these bonds by engaging in our sister city program under the auspices of SCI. We currently have three sister cities around the world—Netanya, Israel, Taormina, Italy and Hengchun, Taiwan. These were first identified as potential “twinning” candidates by residents who either had personal connections to them (Netanya and Hengchun) or had come across an extraordinary city during travel (Taormina). Each city was then carefully vetted by our staff and commission to determine the characteristics that would make us homogenous. These characteristics have ranged from geography to cultural diversity to population. The one thing all our sister cities have in common is that they are all coastal communities like us.

Netanya, our largest sister city, population near 200,000, has a similar economy with coastal high rise development and beach resorts. Hengchun, slightly larger than us with 30,000 residents, serves as the gateway to a national park. Taormina, roughly half the size of us with a population of 11,000, has the deepest historical roots dating back beyond 735 BC. A common characteristic of our sister cities is due to their geography and that they all have economies that are highly dependent upon tourism. On many occasions residents or friends of Sunny Isles Beach have reached out for information to visit one of our sister cities and they are welcomed with open arms. Additionally, we have been fortunate to hear from tourists who visited us from our sister cities.

The mantra of Sister Cities International has proven to us that when you visit a place you have some connection with, you create a much stronger bond and appreciation for that place and its culture. President Eisenhower’s vision could not have been better and our City of Sunny Isles Beach is honored to have three great sister cities. See page 46 for more information.

at your service

At our Government Center, residents can tend to building permits, police reports, mail, library services and more



The 54,000 square-foot Sunny Isles Beach Government Center, opened in January, 2005, is located in a pedestrian friendly area at the heart of the City.

The Government Center presents its most public expression toward Collins Avenue and is represented by the Commission Chamber surrounded by a civic plaza combining landscape, water, and contrasting building materials. This is where the serious business of running the City is conducted. Meetings are generally held the third Thursday of each month.

But what is housed inside this vision? Through inter-governmental partnerships, the first floor is primarily dedicated to services not under the City's administration. Through the Federal Government, a satellite branch of the United States Post Office is open Monday-Friday. In cooperation with Miami-Dade County, the Sunny Isles Beach branch library is open Monday-Saturday and offers many classes and programs utilizing the City's meeting room on the first floor. With support from the Sunny Isles Beach Tourism and Marketing Council, the Visitor Center completes the first floor, offering a wealth of information for tourists or residents looking to find

"something to do" in South Florida. The Center also issues SIB Resident ID Cards for those with a picture ID and utility bill as proof of residence. Tickets to SIB Cultural Events may be purchased there along with branded merchandise depicting SIB, *florida's riviera* or Sunny Isles Beach, Miami.

The second floor houses the SIB Police Department which is open 24/7. During regular business hours, elevators from the lobby take customers to the 2nd floor. After hours, the police department can be accessed via the 2nd level of the parking garage. Accident and crime reports may be requested at the records department.

The third floor of the Government Center is the place for residents, visitors and contractors to visit and address issues of code enforcement and parking, apply for building permits or obtain business licenses. Fire plan reviews from Miami-Dade County are also offered on Wednesdays at this location.

The fourth floor houses the City Commission, the offices of the City Attorney, Clerk and Manager along with human resources and finance departments. Constituents may make appointments to meet with their elected officials over matters that concern them. Public record requests are handled here by the City Clerk.

SUNNY ISLES BEACH LIVING – This quarterly publication contains city updates from the Mayor and City Manager, plus a Calendar of Programs and Events for each season. Readers will also find details regarding activities, sports and classes for youth, adults and seniors. New residents, realtors and visitors have a great resource at their fingertips with which to find locations and information regarding the community center, parks, city services,

restaurants, transportation, hotels and beach amenities.

Nearby hotels, services offered and information which new residents and tourists can use to answer questions are included. This publication is also a great marketing tool for the City, used by realtors and travel planners promoting our City to the world.

EMAIL – To get the most current information conveniently delivered to your inbox, sign up for our free **eSIBi notification service, or electronic Sunny Isles Beach information.** Unsubscribing is easy if the information is no longer needed. On the sibfl.net homepage, go to the ‘Notify Me’ section and select the ‘sign up’ link.



SIBislander – Mailed to every household, this publication comes out monthly announcing programs and events, offering a glimpse of City services and current important resident information.

RADIO – A wealth of information is found at 1120 AM. Listen for information about events, City services and City parks.

SIB TV – A 24/7 broadcast on Atlantic Broadband channel 77 (or 107.5 in digital) and AT&T U-verse channel 99. Beach access, parks, cultural events and City sponsored concerts, calendar of events and meetings, library programming, traffic information and Community Shuttle pick up locations are found here. City Commission scheduled meetings and tape delay broadcasts are also available.

City Manager's Quarterly Report

A Few Things for the Sunny Isles Beach 'to do' List

One of the benefits to living or vacationing in Sunny Isles Beach is that a person can actually DO so without needing a vehicle.

The desirability of our City continues to grow while all the improvements and related construction continues. I would like to use this opportunity to let both our residents and visitors know about a few things you can do to make your stay, or just daily life, more enjoyable in the City.

If you have never been, DO stop in our Visitor Center in the first floor lobby of the Government Center at 18070 Collins Avenue. Whether a visitor or resident, there is something for all: information about City events or places of interest, SIB souvenirs, gifts, high quality apparel, beach gear, or an umbrella.

If you drive your car to the beach, DO park in one of the public parking spaces, and not in any of the retail shopping centers. All retail properties are private and will have your car towed from their spots. There is an abundance of public parking for the beach, and more will be available soon. Don't end a beautiful day in Sunny Isles Beach with the inconvenience and expense of having to retrieve your car from the towing company that the owners of the retail property are contracted with.

At the beach, the first thing you should DO, is consider safety while deciding on your spot. If using an umbrella, pick a location on the beach that is not too close to the water's edge. This enables our lifeguards to maintain a clear view of you, your family, friends, and everyone else who may be in the water. This is critical to their ability to react timely in an emergency. No hotel, condo or individual, nor the City, owns any part of the beach; it is a completely public beach for all to enjoy. Your safety is our greatest concern and being aware of the placement of umbrellas can make a significant difference in identifying someone in distress.

Please DO be careful when walking or bicycling thru the City; especially on State Road A1A known as Collins Avenue. Because of the long and narrow shape of the City most new amenities under construction, including parks, streetscape beautification, landscaping, sidewalks, and utility undergrounding, require placement of either temporary pavement or steel plates while work is in progress. Stay alert of these temporary changes in both the roadway and sidewalk surface materials when walking, jogging, or riding, while these projects are still under construction.

One of the benefits to living or vacationing in Sunny Isles Beach is that a person



can actually DO so without needing a vehicle. The City is amenity laden, enabling patrons to get around on foot, or to use the complimentary City shuttle. In fact, many people DO just that and have eliminated the car from their daily use.

Remember, as you navigate around the City on foot, motorists must yield to pedestrians when they are in the crosswalks or crossing streets. The pedestrian, under Florida Law, has the right of way unless they are clearly jaywalking or violating the law. Please DO be safety minded, whether you are on the sidewalks of our City or crossing the roadways, as you will find you are amongst many others who are getting around without a vehicle.


This fall, DO make sure you take advantage of the many programs offered through our Cultural and Community Services Department for our children. Parents may choose from athletics, to special activity programs, to the After School Program and the new 'twens' after school activity introduced last school year, After School Sportstacular Sports League. There is much available for the children to keep them active, engaged and occupied during the time after school.

Adults and Seniors, DO make sure you are signing up for, or participating in, the many programs, classes or trips available to you. Many programs or events are free to residents or the fee is minimal. Residents of Sunny Isles Beach are also given the benefit of early registration each season.

I hope these "to do" tips make either a stay or everyday life in our City more enjoyable. The City remains an attractive oasis or, as many say, "paradise" which is still a work in progress as we recently celebrated our 19th anniversary of incorporation.

HURRICANE SEASON

The South Florida hurricane season begins on June 1 and ends November 30. Sunny Isles Beach is located in the Zone B floodplain where a hurricane may cause a storm surge, high winds, tornadoes, flooding, or loss of utility services.

Pre-register for Emergency Evacuations

Prior to hurricane season, residents who need assistance with daily living, medical needs, or specialized transportation must pre-register with the Emergency Evacuation Assistance Program. For applications call: Miami-Dade 311 (305.468.5900), TTY/TDD 305.468.5402. Individuals needing a pet-friendly Hurricane Evacuation Center (HEC) must also pre-register by calling 311. For each event the County will announce the HEC that accepts pets.

Hurricane Watches

Residents should follow hurricane watches closely. Even if a hurricane warning or an evacuation order is not issued, City parks and beaches may be closed due to high winds. Residents should clear balconies and secure objects in the yard. The Miami-Dade County School Board will decide when to close the Norman S. Edelcup SIB K-8 School. When the public school is closed, the City's After School Program will also be closed. The SIB Community Shuttle Bus service will stop running when sustained winds reach 30 mph. Information regarding City services will be most current on the web at sibfl.net.

Hurricane Warning

Hurricane warnings are issued 36 hours in advance of anticipated tropical storm force winds. Residents and visitors must complete storm preparations and immediately evacuate if directed. A family should take a 72 hour supply of food, water, medications, and cash to purchase necessary items if the evacuation becomes extended.

Evacuations

If Miami-Dade County gives the order to evacuate Zone B, all visitors in hotels and residents in condos and single-family homes are required by Florida law to evacuate. There will be no emergency services available once the island is evacuated. Try to evacuate to the home of a friend or family member who lives outside of the evacuation zones. Use a Red Cross Hurricane Evacuation Center (HEC) only as a last resort. Hotel staff will assist their guests with other accommodations.

Red Cross Hurricane Evacuation Centers & Bus Pickup Locations

When an evacuation order is given, open Hurricane Evacuation Centers (HECs) will be listed on local radio, television stations and at Miami-Dade County Call Center at 311 (305.468.5900, TTY/TDD 305.468.5402). Every shelter may not be open for every event. The County provides free transportation to HECs from predetermined pickup locations in Sunny Isles Beach:

As the school year ended, so did an era. In 2008, the City opened its first public elementary/middle school, the Sunny Isles Beach K-8 Community School. The opening of a new school is both exhilarating and exhausting. There is a magnitude of logistics to put in place from hiring all of the staff, to outfitting classrooms, to registering students and recruiting parent volunteers. Add in the extra burden of "perfection" expected by the City and this job requires someone highly experienced, organized, and intuitive; a born leader that holds the respect of their peers. Fortunately, Miami-Dade County School Board had just the person, Dr. Annette Weissman.

Dr. Weissman, a veteran educator and principal, had been at Ojus Elementary prior to her appointment to Sunny Isles Beach. Under her direction, the school flourished, earning an A rating all 8 years of her career here. The word spread about this A-rating, and people flocked to SIB to get their children enrolled. Dr. Weissman managed the school through an expansion of 12 more classrooms, increasing capacity to 1900, which was immediately filled. Current enrollment is 2,138.

Now named the Norman S. Edelcup Sunny Isles Beach K-8, our community school has excelled. Years of A-rated success, a team of dedicated administrators and teachers, a thriving volunteer group through the PTSA, a strong partnership with the City, all make the future bright. It is so bright that Dr. Weissman accomplished all she set out to do. She can be very proud of what she established; their high standards, academic achievements, and commitment to community and family involvement. Her legacy will live on as founding principal of NSE/SIB K-8.

As we wish Dr. Weissman all the best in her retirement, we welcome Dr. Adam Kosnitzky to continue the great work started and carry us forward.

GUEST POLICIES

A member may bring a guest to the Community Center to use the Phyllis and Ranaan Katz Sports Center (gymnasium) only (not the computer lab or fitness center) according to the following rules:

- ❑ The guest must check in with the front office, present photo ID and sign a waiver.
- ❑ A member may bring only one guest per visit.
- ❑ The guest will be charged a \$5 fee per visit.

RESIDENCE QUALIFICATION

In order to receive the resident rate, proof of residence is required at the time of registration.

- ❑ Adults are required to show proof of residence.
- ❑ Children must have the same residence of the parent or legal guardian.
- ❑ A photo ID must be presented for identification purposes, in addition to one of the following documents:
 - Current vehicle registration.
 - Current voter's registration card.
 - Current utility bill displaying both name and address of Sunny Isles Beach property. Examples are phone, cable, FPL, water bill.

- Current lease agreement identifying tenants residing in a SIB residence, plus a condo office letter.
- ❑ Children ages 13 and under must be enrolled in a supervised program unless under the supervision of an adult.

Program Registration

Registration for all programs, classes and activities offered by Cultural & Community Services may be processed at Pelican Community Park, 18115 North Bay Rd. or the Government Center, 18070 Collins Ave.

For programs held at Pelican Community Park, except for after school programs or summer camp, registration dates are based on membership. For programs held at a facility or park other than Pelican Community Park, or for after school program and summer camp, the registration dates are based on residence.

Registration for members and residents begins on Monday, August 8 and Wednesday, August 24 for non-members and non-residents.

The deadline to register for a course is two days prior to the course start date, however, it's best to register early.

Payment is accepted in cash (bills no larger than \$20), credit card (VISA/MasterCard/AMEX) and checks made payable to the "City of Sunny Isles Beach." For information about program content and instructors, call 305.792.1706.



Clean Water Campaign

The City encourages citizens and visitors alike to comply with the 1987 Water Quality Act. To assist and educate, the City produced the *Citizen's Guide' Book* which defines what compliance is and why it is critical to have agencies working with the Environmental Protection Agency to implement a stormwater management program ensuring water pollution is reduced to the 'maximum extent practicable'.

The *Citizen's Guide' Book* provides information about stormwater—what it is, why it is important to keep it clean and lists some practical do's and don'ts while at home, at work and at play.

For the most part, water entering storm drains, unlike water entering sanitary sewers, does not get treated. Polluted water entering into our waterways is harmful to plants and animals. The main three types of stormwater pollutants are litter (cans, paper or plastic, cigarettes); chemicals; and organic waste.

Individually and collectively we can 'do the right thing' to reduce our contribution to the water pollution by disposing of items properly. Keep in mind, "only rain down the drain".

Taormina, Italy


