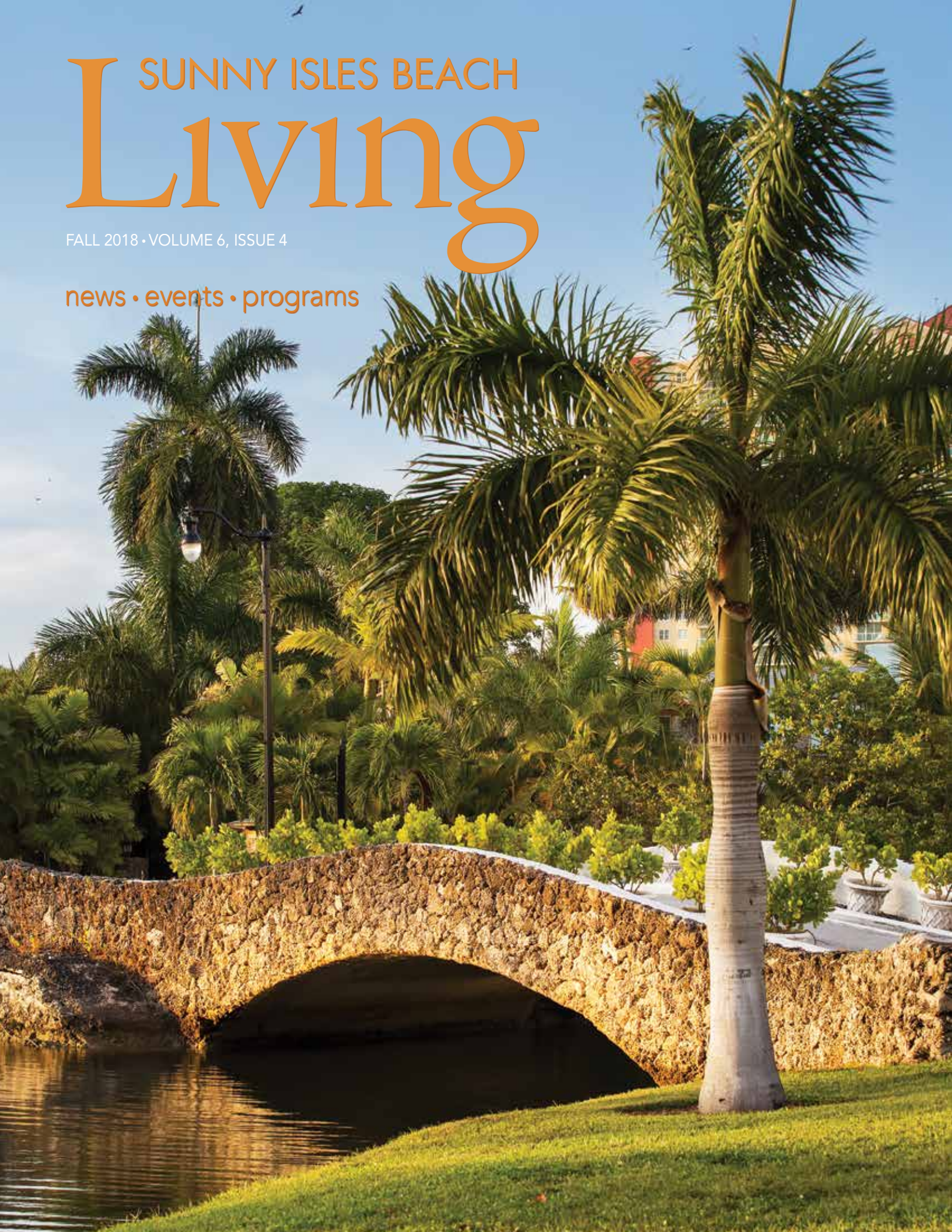

We live in a world where staying connected is extremely simple. Computers, tablets, smartphones, and smart watches all place information at your fingertips. We established the “Mayor’s Technology Challenge” in 2016 to improve our residents’ and visitors’ quality of life and communication through innovative technologies.

During the fall, we plan to launch our next technology initiative, SIBAlert. SIBAlert will enable citizens to receive emergency notices and warnings from the City. Based on location, we can ensure residents and visitors receive accurate and up-to-date information during critical incidents or emergencies. SIBAlert sends notifications via a collection of delivery methods including phone calls, SMS text messages, emails, and a mobile application.

Signing up is quick and easy. I urge all our citizens, both residents and visitors, to visit sibalert.net in the coming months and register for our emergency notifications. These notifications will help keep you informed and safe in the event of an emergency.

Since the announcement of the “Technology Challenge,” we have achieved remarkable technological strides. Our expanded free WiFi coverage allows residents and visitors to stay connected throughout the majority of public areas, recently including all buses in our SIB*shuttle* service and many locations across the beach through solar units on the lifeguard stands. Soofa benches, which are solar-powered charging stations, keep park-goers fully charged in eight out of our eleven City parks. An electric car charging station in the SIB Government Center parking lot is not only a technological feat, but also a green initiative. Touchscreen kiosks at two premier parks offer users an interactive and fun way to gather information. And the SIB*shuttle* mobile application makes our free shuttle bus service more accessible and easy-to-use.

Communicating with our residents and visitors is fundamental. We strive to disseminate accurate, relevant, and timely information. With the deluge of information from a variety of sources, you can trust the City of Sunny Isles Beach to tell you what you need to know, when you need to know it. Good communication and good technology are the keys to good government.

The Sunny Isles Beach Government Center, situated in a pedestrian-friendly area at the heart of the City, opened in January 2005.

Within the 54,000-sq.-ft. edifice is the Commission Chamber surrounded by a civic plaza, combining landscape, water, and contrasting building materials. The inner-operations of the City are conducted in this building, and government meetings are generally held the third Thursday of each month.

Housed inside this vision you will find a satellite branch of the United States Post Office open Monday-Friday, brought through a partnership with the Federal Government, and the MDC Sunny Isles Beach branch library open Monday-Saturday, which offers an assortment of classes and programs in the City's first floor meeting room.

The first floor is completed with a Visitor Center, supported by the Sunny Isles Beach Tourism and Marketing Council. The Visitor Center offers tourists and residents alike a wealth of resources for finding activities and events

around South Florida. Sunny Isles Beach branded merchandise along with tickets to SIB Cultural Events are available for purchase in the Center as well.

Housed on the second floor of the Government Center is the SIB Police Department, open 24/7. Elevators from the lobby take visitors to the second floor during regular business hours, though after hours, the police department can only be accessed via the second level of the parking garage. Accident and crime reports may be requested at the records department.

The third floor of the Government Center provides residents, visitors and contractors information regarding code enforcement, parking, building permits and business licensing.

The fourth floor is home to the City Commission; offices of the City Attorney, Clerk and Manager; human resources department; and finance department. Constituents may make appointments to meet with their elected officials or request public records from the City Clerk.

With a City of more than 20,000 residents and visitors topping 1 million, effective communication is essential to keep all informed of available services, upcoming events, and City news and updates. EMAIL — To get the most current information conveniently delivered to your inbox, sign up for our free eSIBi notification service, or electronic Sunny Isles Beach information. Unsubscribing is easy if the information is no longer needed. Visit sibfl.net/notifyme to sign up.

PHOTO GALLERY — We take photos at many of the events hosted by the City. These photos are edited and uploaded to our online photo gallery, hosted by Image Event. Look through past events and download any pictures you may want to keep at imageevent.com/sunnyislesbeach.

RADIO — A wealth of information is available at 1120 AM. Listen for information about events, City services and City parks.

SIBislander — Mailed to every household, this publication comes out monthly announcing programs and events, offering a glimpse of City services and current important resident information.



SIBTV — A 24/7 broadcast on Atlantic Broadband channel 92 (or 107.5 without converter box) and AT&T U-verse channel 99. Beach access, parks, cultural events and City-sponsored concerts, calendar of events and meetings, library programming, traffic information and SIBshuttle pick up locations are found here. City Commission scheduled meetings and tape delay broadcasts are also available.

SOCIAL MEDIA — Stay up-to-date with upcoming events, important announcements and traffic alerts by following @CityofSIB on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. For important safety tips, emergency alerts and other police-related news, follow the Sunny Isles Beach Police Department @SIBPD on Facebook and Twitter. Social media is an excellent way to connect with your community and learn about new services and programs offered by the City.

SUNNY ISLES BEACH LIVING — This quarterly publication contains City updates from the Mayor and City Manager, along with a Calendar of Events and Programs for each season. This is a valuable resource with which to find information regarding local and regional services and activities.

VIMEO — Our production team records City events, concerts and activities and produces them into short recaps, promos, full concert shows or informational pieces. These videos are broadcast on SIBTV and can be found online at our Vimeo Channel: vimeo.com/cityofsunnyislesbeach.

STAY CONNECTED

SIBAlert: Emergency Notifications

This summer we announced our new emergency notification system, SIBAlert. In preparation for future emergencies, the City is taking advantage of a free program offered by Everbridge through the State of Florida.

Signing up for SIBAlert enables citizens to receive accurate and up-to-date emergency notices and warnings from the City, based on location. SIBAlert sends notifications via a collection of delivery methods including phone calls, SMS text messages, emails, and a mobile application.

Signing up online is quick and easy: visit sibalert.net and create a free account with Everbridge. We also encourage you to download the free Everbridge app on your mobile device, so that during times of crisis, your family will have emergency alerts from the City at your fingertips.

Especially during hurricane season, it is important to stay connected and be informed about evacuations, closures and the status of utilities.

City Manager's Quarterly Report

Sunny Isles Beach Coming of Age

We continue forward thinking leadership, which will keep us ever mindful of past experiences.

The common definition for the term coming-of-age is a description of the transition between childhood and adulthood. For some cultures, coming-of-age is determined at a specific age when a child is no longer a minor. Well, as of this past June, our City is no longer a child, and has entered the early stages of adulthood at the ripe age of 21.

Every experience we have gone through as a city over the past 21 years has, in one way or another, helped us to develop the understanding that coming-of-age is really a life-long journey. There have been major events and experiences that have played a very important part in our journey to adulthood. For example, there were some growing pains within the first two years of our existence resulting in a major shakeup in the management of the City. From that point on though, the City was on a sustained, progressive path forward.

There was exuberance and pride with the grand opening of Samson Oceanfront Park. There was lively debate over the creation of the City's Comprehensive Plan, which resulted in unprecedented luxury high-rise development on the east side of Collins Avenue. With the development came remarkable revenues that, in turn, supported the much needed rehabilitation of the City's infrastructure and the creation of 11 magnificent parks and many programs.

There were also some sadder moments, including the sudden death of our first mayor, David Samson, and subsequently some of our other founding mothers and fathers. There were serious moments involving the perseverance and dedication of the men and women of our then new Police Department cleaning up criminal activity that had developed in our City due to the lack of police presence prior to incorporation. I would be remiss if I didn't take a moment to remember all the risks that our sworn officers have taken over the past 20 years to make Sunny Isles Beach one of the safest cities in the state of Florida. Much of this exemplary police work came under the stewardship of our Chief, Fred Maas, who has recently retired after 20 years of service and has been inducted into the Florida Law Enforcement Officers' Hall of Fame.

Each one of these experiences, trials, successes, anguishes, and joys has had a significant impact on what the City has become today and has contributed to the achievement of our goal being a world-class city. A major contributing factor to this success has been the continuity in our outstanding professional staff, some of whom have been with our city for many or all of our 21 years. The benefits from the stability and knowledge of our staff are clearly visible. This City has been as much a part of their professional growth as it has been a beneficiary of their commitment and dedication to the City.

There are many examples of staff initiative that I could cite, but the development of our summer camp says it all. A pilot day camp program began the summer of 2000 with 35 children attending; it was a success and was included as a budgeted item in the 2000-2001 Fiscal Year. It has become a thriving multi-program day camp with almost 600 children participating in themed camps each summer.

Community engagement and involvement has also grown quicker than a toddler becomes a school-aged student. In the beginning, there were many citizens who volunteered and contributed time and expertise. This grew into a more formalized City Advisory Committee, now charged with making recommendations on many issues to the City Commission. Just recently we have had advisory assistance from residents on our Transportation Master Plan and Cultural Master Plan. Our new Public Art Advisory Committee is charged with making recommendations to the City Commission on aspects of public art in our City. As our population has grown, so has the general overall interest in city affairs, generating the growth of grassroots groups that have become informally involved in making thoughtful recommendations to the city government from time to time.

Under the leadership of our Mayor and support of the Commission, we continue to mature as we enter adulthood. We continue forward thinking leadership, which will keep us ever mindful of past experiences, while learning from the community and inspiring our staff to achieve greater heights.

HURRICANE SEASON

South Florida hurricane season begins on June 1 and ends November 30. Sunny Isles Beach is located in the Zone B floodplain where a hurricane may cause a storm surge, high winds, tornadoes, flooding, or loss of utility services. Be prepared.

Pre-register for Emergency Evacuations

Prior to hurricane season, residents who need assistance with daily living, medical needs, or specialized transportation must pre-register with the Emergency Evacuation Assistance Program. For applications call: Miami-Dade 311 (305.468.5900), TTY/TDD 305.468.5402. Individuals needing a pet-friendly Hurricane Evacuation Center (HEC) must also pre-register by calling 311. For each event the County will announce the HEC that accepts pets.

Hurricane Watches

Residents should follow hurricane watches closely. Even if a hurricane warning or an evacuation order is not issued, City parks and beaches may be closed due to high winds. Residents should clear balconies and secure objects in the yard. The Miami-Dade County School Board will decide when to close the Norman S. Edelcup SIB K-8 School. When the public school is closed, the City's After School Program will also be closed. The SIB Community Shuttle Bus service will stop running when sustained winds reach 30 mph. Information regarding City services will be most current on the web at sibfl.net/emergency and through social media.

Hurricane Warning

Hurricane warnings are issued 36 hours in advance of anticipated tropical storm force winds. Residents and visitors must complete storm preparations and immediately evacuate if directed. A family should take a 72 hour supply of food, water, medications, and cash to purchase necessary items if the evacuation becomes extended.

Evacuations

If Miami-Dade County gives the order to evacuate Zone B, all visitors in hotels and residents in condos and single-family homes are required by Florida law to evacuate. There will be no emergency services available once the island is evacuated. Try to evacuate to the home of a friend or family member who lives outside of the evacuation zones. Use a Red Cross Hurricane Evacuation Center (HEC) only as a last resort. Hotel staff will assist their guests with other accommodations.

Red Cross Hurricane Evacuation Centers & Bus Pickup Locations

When an evacuation order is given, open Hurricane Evacuation Centers (HECs) will be listed on local radio, television stations and at Miami-Dade County Call Center at 311 (305.468.5900, TTY/TDD 305.468.5402). Every shelter may not be open for every event. The County provides free transportation to HECs from predetermined pickup locations in Sunny Isles Beach:

There is much to celebrate about the previous 10 years at Pelican Community Park, and we hope to continue being part of your family fun for many years to come.

This past August marked the 10th anniversary of the grand opening of Pelican Community Park, one of the City of Sunny Isles Beach's beloved and most popular parks. Throughout the last 10 years, the park has undergone remarkable developments, enhancing our departmental offerings and programs.

Before, our team consisted of only five full-time employees and an assortment of part-time seasonal positions, including athletics and camps. We rented space from St. Mary Magdalen Church and Temple B'Nai Zion to house our summer camp, and we set up basketball hoops in the parking lot of the church to run our seasonal basketball program.

Now, we have a team consisting of 49 full-time employees, plus more than 40 part-time regular and temporary positions. We are proud of our beautiful facility equipped with a 10,000 square foot gymnasium, which lends itself to numerous activities, including basketball, cheerleading, gymnastics, and volleyball. Our indoor multipurpose space of approximately 5,000 square feet is used for after school programs, summer camp, and recreation programs.

One of the most visible features of the park is our Chief Fred Maas Little League Baseball Field, named after our cherished police chief, Fred Maas, who recently retired in July. This large outdoor space is ideal for children to learn the foundation of baseball skills and techniques, especially through our partnership with North Miami Beach Little League, which offers more competitive play during the spring. In recent years, the turf field became home to several other programs, including Field Hockey and FAB (Fun Activity Based) Fitness.

There is much to celebrate about the previous 10 years at Pelican Community Park, and we hope to continue being part of your family fun for many years to come.
