

from our Mayor

We are coming up on another election season during which I urge you to get informed and vote if you are able.

Our municipal elections have staggered four-year terms. This means that three of our five elected positions (Mayor and residential area Commission seats 2 and 4) will be up for election this year. In two years, two positions (residential area Commission seats 1 and 3) will be up for election.

The City Charter was designed this way to ensure continuity to our City Commission. Staggered terms make sure that the Commission is not composed of all newly elected officials in the same year. Who governs our City has a major impact on the direction of our community and how our City is managed. While a lot of us do not exercise our right to vote, many of us vote but do not spend the time to familiarize ourselves with the candidates on the municipal and county level. We typically have stronger feelings about governor, senate, congress and presidential races. Perhaps this is because of intense press coverage and that these are partisan races, meaning candidates run with a political party affiliation.

Our municipal and county elections are non-partisan. Often voters are the least familiar with these candidates, however, municipal and county elected officials can have some of the most direct impact on our quality of life. So, before you vote, take some time to familiarize yourself with the backgrounds of the candidates and their positions. Typically, registered voters will receive a lot of mail from candidates. Additionally, our local newspapers will run articles in print and online describing candidates in most local races. Finally, there are usually local activities devoted to candidate forums and debates.

Look out for these as they will be some of the best opportunities to meet and hear from your local candidates, which will enable you to make an informed voting decision. In the end, the most important outcome of election season is not who wins or loses; it is that all of us exercise our right to vote for the candidates of our own choosing.

SIBAlert

The City is rolling out a new emergency notification system: SIBAlert. SIBAlert enables citizens to receive accurate and up-to-date notices and warnings from the City of Sunny Isles Beach during critical incidents and emergencies. Notifications are sent based on location through a variety of methods including phone calls, SMS text messages, emails and a mobile application. You can choose any and all methods of alerts you would like to receive.

This system provides you with critical, time-sensitive information quickly during a variety of situations, such as severe weather, unexpected road closures, hurricane evacuations, boil water notices, and major traffic delays or accidents.

To sign up, visit sibalert.net and create your account today. We recommend creating a contact in your phone for SIBAlert: our caller ID number is 305.792.1911; our email display is: SIBAlert (sibalert@sibfl.net); and text messages come from 89361.

We also encourage you to download the Everbridge app to your mobile device so that during times of crisis, you and your family will receive emergency alerts from trusted sources, your local City government and law enforcement agency. Just search "Everbridge" in the App or Google Play stores.

Fall Programs

The beginning of a new school year is a great time to enroll your child in a fall activity or athletic program. In addition to our favorite recurring programs such as karate, chess, cheerleading, and basketball, we are offering some exciting new programs. Beginning September 13, Super Soccer Stars offers an introductory class on the fundamental skills of this popular sport for ages two to five years old.

Code Explorers allows children ages 4 to 13 an opportunity to delve into computational thinking and coding appropriate to their age level. FAB (Fun Activity Based) Fitness is a high-energy one-hour session designed for kids to get active and develop coordination while playing exciting games. Following the success of our summer camp, Bomb Squad Baseball Academy is back for the fall as former professional baseball player, Smaily Borges, teaches fundamental and progressive skills. Short-Term Vacation Rental Program

For residents, living in a safe and secure neighborhood is imperative. Short-term vacation rentals have previously caused negative impacts in the City, and last May, the City Commission passed the Short-Term Vacation Rentals Ordinance requiring all owners renting condominiums or apartments for six months or under to obtain a license from the City. This Ordinance will help protect the public welfare and ensure peace of mind for our residents.

Beginning October 1, 2018, the Planning and Zoning department will begin accepting applications, with enforcement commencing on December 1, 2018. There are several components to the application including, but not limited to, proof of a DBPR Transient Public Lodging Establishment License and Certificate of Registration with the Florida Department of Revenue and Miami-Dade County Tax Collector.

In January of 2013, we introduced the inaugural Car Show in Sunny Isles Beach. Five years later, this event has grown to be one of my favorites. Every car is unique and tells its own story. Our most recent Car Show held in May found a new home at Gateway Park. This move helped us accommodate a growing number of cars, vendors, and attendees. The additional space at Gateway opened up new opportunities for development and fresh partnerships.

I recently met with the production company to brainstorm new ideas for the upcoming Car Show on Saturday, October 13, and I think our residents are going to be very pleased with the outcome. You can expect all your favorite vendors, in addition to a new twist. Not only will you get to view the classic cars shining on the lawn, but you can also browse through vendors selling handcrafted jewelry, soaps and more at our Craft Fair. Whether you are a car enthusiast or a maker at heart, the Car Show and Craft Fair offers a great afternoon out.

As you might have read in previous

publications, Gateway Park is quickly becoming the hub for our cultural and larger-scale special events, such as the Car Show. The great amenities of the five-acre park, including the performance stage, playground, and parking garage with more than 300 spots, provide an opportunity for the growth of larger events.

The first notable event at Gateway Park was the 10th Annual SIB Jazz Fest, which also happened to be our most successful Jazz Fest in recent years. More than 1,000 jazz lovers enjoyed our stellar lineup of artists last year at Gateway Park, which has now become the home of our premier festival. More recently this summer, we held two musical productions, *Dueling Pianos* and *Decades Rewind*, both of which brought out our residents in droves.

We will be continuing our offerings of bigger and better productions here in Sunny Isles Beach this October. In addition to the Car Show, next month we are launching our new Gateway LIVE! series. Gateway LIVE! is bringing various cultural genres and live performances by

talented musicians, theatre productions, and entertainers to our City. These are not your typical concerts. The best part of this quarterly series is that it is free for Sunny Isles Beach residents with a valid Resident ID Card.

Kicking off the series on Saturday, October 6 is a concert by global music sensation, Ethan Bortnick, Guinness certified as "The World's Youngest solo musician to headline his own concert tour." Already on the Gateway LIVE! schedule for February 2019 is the Chinese Acrobats of Hebei. This unique performance is guaranteed to amaze audiences with its stunning acrobatics, costumes, Chinese props, and beautiful music.

Condo Clinic Helps Residents Know Their Rights Under State Condominium Act

Issues with condominium associations are among the most vexing concerns of our City's residents. That's why I've been working hard to ensure that our residents know their rights under Florida's Condominium Act.

The state's Division of Condominiums recently proposed new rules that would provide enhanced enforcement and civil penalties for non-compliance with the Condominium Act. The Division is hearing public comments about the new rules, which are needed after recent changes were made to the state law.

Our City's condo associations will soon be subject to fines and penalties for additional violations. The list of "minor offenses" under the proposed new rules has diminished. But the list of "major offenses" has expanded. These include improper board elections, failure to provide official records, conflict of interest disclosures, and violations of fiduciary duty.

Equally important, the proposed rules reflect a major policy shift from education and rehabilitation, to enforcement. These enhanced compliance measures are welcome news for our residents.

As a City Commissioner, I have met so many residents and have always done my best to assist all individuals—even those outside of our City—with their problems.

I am now escalating my commitment to help our residents by hosting periodic "Condo Clinics" at City Hall. These meetings will allow me to help more of our residents. I am here to ensure that our city becomes a valuable resource, and even an advocate, to protect your rights.

Welcome Back: Traffic Safety Tips for the New School Year

- Never stop in traffic to drop off your child. You may think it's convenient, but it is also dangerous and illegal.
- When walking, be aware of your surroundings and pay attention to the school crossing guards; they are there for your safety.

Behind the Scenes With Ocean Rescue

Long summer days at the beach might be over, but beach safety never stops. Our Ocean Rescue division works year-round to keep you safe in and out of the water. With 10 lifeguard towers stationed across approximately two miles of beach, our team of 37 lifeguards is trained to prevent, rescue, and assist in first aid.

The safety and enjoyment of all beach goers is important, so please follow our beach rules and regulations:

- Do not swim in dangerous water conditions.
- Do not disturb sea turtles or their nests.
- Use of umbrellas and tents are permitted as long as they do not obstruct Ocean Rescue's view of the water.
- Directives given by the lifeguards must be adhered to at all times.
- Glass containers, fishing, camping, and fireworks/explosives are among the list of items not allowed on the beach.
