You are probably asking yourself, "Why would the mayor of a coastal city be writing about sun protection during the fall and winter?" The answer is because this is the time of year that we tend to let our guard down! In South Florida we enjoy a tropical climate year-round and must stay vigilant all year regarding protection from the sun's ultraviolet (UV) rays. I recently came across key tips from some of the country's leading dermatologists and thought it would be good to share them with our residents and guests.


- 1. Put on broad spectrum, at least SPF-30, sunscreen before getting dressed. Working around your clothes causes you to miss spots. Additionally, it takes about 20 minutes for sunscreen to sink in, so putting it on before you go outside gives it time to become fully protective.
- 2. Did you know there are sun pills that can assist in providing extra protection by treating your skin from the inside out? Check with your dermatologist and you can take the recommended dose in the morning if you know you'll be outside for long periods of time. But keep in mind that you still must wear plenty of sunscreen.
- 3. Never rely on makeup. Women often rely on makeup, but on average it would take 14 times the amount of makeup to equal one proper coating of sunscreen.
- 4. Purchase fresh sunscreen each year. We all have old bottles lurking around. However, sunscreen loses its potency so check the expiration dates and adhere to them.
- 5. Don't avoid your eyes, even if you are wearing sunglasses as sunglasses can actually magnify UV exposure. The thin skin around your eyes needs extra protection, so look for a sunscreen brand that is less irritating to your eyes.
- 6. Think about your head and feet. Your part line in your scalp and the bottom of your feet can both get burned without proper protection.

Our beaches and year-round tropical weather are one of the greatest attractions to our community. Let's enjoy them responsibly and take care of ourselves in the process!



he Sunny Isles Beach Government Center, situated in a pedestrian-friendly area at the heart of the City, opened in January 2005.

Within the 54,000-sq.-ft. edifice is the Commission Chamber surrounded by a civic plaza, combining landscape, water, and contrasting building materials. The inner-operations of the City are conducted in this building, and government meetings are generally held the third Thursday of each month.

Housed inside this vision you will find a satellite branch of the United States Post Office open Monday-Friday, brought through a partnership with the Federal Government, and the MDC Sunny Isles Beach branch library open Monday-Saturday, which offers an assortment of classes and programs in the City's first floor meeting room.

The first floor is completed with a Visitor Center, supported by the Sunny Isles Beach Tourism and Marketing Council. The Visitor Center offers tourists and residents alike a wealth of resources for finding activities and events around South Florida. Sunny Isles Beach branded merchandise along with tickets to SIB Cultural Events are available for purchase as well.

Housed on the second floor of the Government Center is the SIB Police Department, open 24/7. Elevators from the lobby take visitors to the second floor during regular business hours, though after hours, the police department can only be accessed via the second level of the parking garage. Accident and crime reports may be requested at the records department.

The third floor of the Government Center provides residents, visitors and contractors information regarding code compliance, parking, building permits and business licensing.

The fourth floor is home to the City Commission; offices of the City Attorney, Clerk and Manager; human resources department; and finance department. Constituents may make appointments to meet with their elected officials or request public records from the City Clerk.

**RADIO** — A wealth of information is available at 1120 AM. Listen for information about events, City services and City parks.

**SIBislander** — Mailed to every household, this publication comes out monthly announcing programs and events, offering a glimpse of City services and current important resident information.

**SIBTV** — A 24/7 broadcast on Atlantic Broadband channel 92 (or 107.5 without converter box) and AT&T U-verse channel 99. Beach access, parks, cultural events and City-sponsored concerts, calendar of events and meetings, library programming, traffic information and SIBshuttle pick up locations are found here. City Commission scheduled meetings and tape delay broadcasts are also available.

**SOCIAL MEDIA** — Stay up-to-date with upcoming events, important announcements and traffic alerts by following @CityofSIB on Facebook, Twitter and Instagram. For important safety tips, emergency alerts and other police-related news, follow the Sunny Isles Beach Police Department @SIBPD on Facebook and Twitter. This summer we announced our new emergency notification system, SIBAlert. In preparation for future emergencies, the City is taking advantage of a free program offered by Everbridge through the State of Florida.

Signing up for SIBAlert enables citizens to receive accurate and up-todate emergency notices and warnings from the City, based on location. SIBAlert sends notifications via a collection of delivery methods including phone calls, SMS text messages, emails, and a mobile application.

Signing up online is quick and easy: visit sibalert.net and create a free account with Everbridge. We also encourage you to download the free Everbridge app on your mobile device, so that during times of crisis, your family will have emergency alerts from the City at your fingertips.

Especially during hurricane season, it is important to stay connected and be informed about evacuations, closures and the status of utilities.

## City Manager's Quarterly Report

#### A Vision for Public Art in Sunny Isles Beach

When asked about the most important beneficiaries of the public art, there was unanimous consent that our citizens were the City's top priority.

On September 4, 2018, the City convened a joint workshop of the City Commission and the newly formed Public Arts Advisory Committee to discuss and develop a vision for planning public art in Sunny Isles Beach. During that workshop there was a lengthy discussion about the City's shared community values, all of which fall under the umbrella of creating "quality of life" and "quality of place."

This pretty much sums up the philosophy of this City as it has evolved over the last 21 years. Under the umbrella of quality of life and place, the City Commission embraced many specific core ideas. One is the concept of "inclusion" and the celebration of the different languages and distinctive cultures enjoyed in this community. To that end, in 2017 the Commission launched an organized effort for the purpose of community and cultural bridge-building, the PAAC being organized as part of that effort. The second concept under this umbrella is respect and recognition of high standards of design quality, creativity, and imagination. This has been evidenced by all of the forward thinking decisions implemented since the inception of the City. The most significant decision was the creation of the Transferable Development Rights Ordinance (TDR), which allowed land for parks to be donated while the development rights from that land could be sold and transferred. In most cases, the TDRs would be used on the east side of Collins Avenue. The funds gained have built 11 City parks and have significantly paid for much of the City's infrastructure upgrading over the years. There is still more to come in creating future parks, open space, and more opportunities for creativity and art.


The City is united behind its recognition and promotion of family life, with an emphasis on promoting citizen interactivity. This has been evidenced by the creative partnership the City established with the MDC School Board, which resulted in building the City's own K-8 school as well as expanding the existing full range of cultural programming for families, and various cultural heritage events.

Out of this discussion, another highly significant direction for our staff was solidified. When asked about the most important beneficiaries of the public art, there was unanimous consent that our citizens were the City's top priority. Although the City has iconic buildings and destination hotels, and enjoys a reputation as a world-class destination for many visitors and tourists, such tourism more and more happens on its own through the reputation of these fine destinations. This workshop was another venue where it became clear that, unlike jurisdictions such as Miami Beach or Miami, the elected officials of the City of Sunny Isles Beach wish to truly focus their efforts on the quality of life and place for its residents.

There was a consensus that art could be part of creative place making (marrying form and function), in some cases carrying a sophistication of design as befits a city with the stature of Sunny Isles Beach. That art, like our architecture, might attract visitors to the City, and is for the improvement of the aesthetic vision and the enjoyment of the citizenry. The Mayor likened this balance to the programming of the City's Jazz Fest, which historically always tried to create a balance between popular music and classical jazz.

The City aims to maintain forward thinking in all of its actions, including the selection of public art. It wants to engage the citizenry and select art that becomes interactive. For example, some of the art chosen may have a theme, i.e. "health and wellness" or "cultivation of gardens." It may be educational or bring in science or nature. We will try to make our shade structures, our benches, and our signage artistic and unique. Light Art, the creation of art walls and unique spaces within the confines of the community values expressed above, and sculpture were among the forms of arts most discussed. The installations could be of a temporary or permanent nature.

The PAAC is working on a long-range siting plan for the numerous public spaces and parks the City has acquired and developed or will develop. This will begin with the concept design for the City's ART Park, which is part of Town Center Park. Once completed, this park will become one of the few of its kind that exist in the United States. We have high hopes for the success and work being undertaken by this talented group of residents and staff.

#### THE MEANING OF PEDESTRIAN SIGNALS

#### Walking person symbol

Stays on about 7 to 15 seconds

ACTION: Walk briskly across the crosswalk.

#### Flashing hand symbol

Counts down by seconds

ACTION: Consider where you are before you take action. If you are in the middle of the crosswalk, keep walking briskly. If you are standing on the curb, stop. DO NOT start crossing; wait for the next walk signal. The flashing red hand tells you there is not enough time to begin walking.

#### NON-flashing hand symbol

**ACTION: DO NOT WALK** 

Wait for the Walking Person signal to flash. Your safety is worth a few seconds more of wait time.

## for your safety

Please review these guidelines to ensure a safer experience in Sunny Isles Beach for resident and visiting pedestrians, cyclists and vehicular traffic. The speed limit on both state roads, Collins Avenue and Sunny Isles Boulevard, is 35 miles per hour. The speed limit on all side streets in the City is 20 miles per hour. At designated times, in school zones, the speed limit is enforced at 15 miles per hour.

#### On the Road

- Remember: pedestrians always have the right-of-way
- · Use caution when turning and look both ways to ensure a pedestrian is not in a
- When the pedestrian crossing light is flashing, vehicles MUST stop; it's the law
- · Vehicles must come to a complete stop in both directions when a school bus is stopped with flashing lights
- · No stopping or standing is permitted in driving lanes
- · Always wear a seat belt in the car
- · Do not text while operating a motor vehicle

#### On the Sidewalk

- Never assume a vehicle will stop for you; do not rely on drivers to see you
- · Walk on sidewalks and do not leave the curb suddenly
- · Cross at intersections with traffic lights featuring a lighted 'walking person'
- City Ordinance 2014-432 prohibits skateboards and hoverboards on sidewalks along Collins Avenue and Sunny Isles Boulevard

#### On a Bicycle

- · Bicyclists may ride from Heritage Park in the north end of the City to Gateway Park in the south with only a short traverse onto Collins Avenue near Publix
- · Always wear a bike helmet properly
- To be more visible to motorists use front and back flashing lights
- · Use hand signals when turning or slowing to a stop
- · While bicycles should have the right-of-way, make eye contact with drivers to understand their intentions

## welcome!



"Reduce, Reuse, Recycle." How can each one of us help?

Living and working in Sunny Isles Beach, with the beauty of the Atlantic Ocean and the Intracoastal Waterways surrounding us, is a gift that we are all grateful for. But with that gift comes responsibility. We are sitting on the edge of a vast ocean filled with life that depends on us to act responsibly. Despite public awareness campaigns and efforts, our earth and waterways have become the dumping ground for trash. Some of the pollution is unavoidable and out of our control, but how we dispose of our own waste is under our personal control.

When trash ends up in waterways, sea creatures are greatly affected. Items such as straws, plastic bags, and bottles, can be ingested by wildlife or embedded in coral reefs. Plastic straws are in the top five items collected on the beach every year and unfortunately, plastic does not ever completely disintegrate. According to the Florida Recreation and Park Association (FRPA) Fall 2018 Journal, about ninety percent of seabirds and thirty percent of turtles have plastics in their stomach. This has become a focus of attention, and in early 2018, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) began a "Skip the Straw" initiative, to help promote a change in thinking. If everyone in Florida took the pledge to skip the straw for one week, we could reduce the pollution from plastic straws by 2.35 million.

Here in Sunny Isles Beach, residents and visitors can make a conscious choice to act on these three words: "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle." How can each one of us help? Reduce your use of single-use items such as straws. Reuse washable containers to pack lunches and store leftovers. Recycle everything your waste management company will take, separating paper, plastic and glass as required. Other ways you can help include cleaning up after yourself when visiting the beach; properly dispose of trash in receptacles provided; participate in an annual beach or waterway clean-up; educate your children and family on the proper disposal of waste. Any of these steps can seem like a small action but if we all participate, it can have a big impact.

While the City strives to maintain clean streets, parks and beaches, we also need our residents and visitors to do their part to protect our environment and natural resources. Working together, we can protect the beautiful waters that surround us for many years to come.



#### Membership and Program Registration

#### **GUEST POLICIES**

A member may bring a guest to the Community Center to use the Phyllis and Ranaan Katz Sports Center (gymnasium) only (not the computer lab or fitness center) according to the following rules:

- The guest must check in with the front office, present photo ID and sign a waiver.
- A member may bring only one guest per visit.
- The guest will be charged a \$5 fee per visit.

#### **RESIDENCE QUALIFICATION**

In order to receive the resident rate, you must obtain a Sunny Isles Beach Resident ID Card. A government-issued photo ID must be presented, and a current deed/lease, accompanied by a letter from condo/management office stating who resides in the unit, in addition to at least TWO of the following documents:

- Utility bill, i.e. electric, phone, or cable: within last 3 months
- Current car registration and insurance
- Credit/debit card statement: within last 3 months.

All documents must be valid and include the residential address used on the registration form.

#### MEMBERSHIP BENEFITS AND INFORMATION

Twelve and six month memberships to the Community Center at Pelican Community Park offer many advantages, including:

- Priority registration in most programs, athletic leagues and lessons held at the Community Center.
