from our Mayor

I am grateful that our city evaded a devastating hurricane last month.



While originally in the center of Hurricane Dorian's projected path, the storm's northward turn spared Sunny Isles Beach a wealth of damage.

I want to commend City staff for their excellent hurricane preparation. Throughout the last year, each department has been working hard to update their emergency management plans, and they far exceeded my expectations.

If you follow us on social media, you know that our City communications greatly improved since the last major storm in 2017. We used social media as an interactive means to relay official City information to residents and visitors as well as answer your questions with accurate, official answers. Our total social media engagement increased greatly; Facebook was up by 266 percent and Twitter was up by 383 percent. This shows you were listening to our important messages. You were the first to know about our sandbag distributions, program updates, and nearly 700 of you signed up for notifications on SIBAlert in just five days. Social media is the best place to find essential hurricane-related information regarding the City of Sunny Isles Beach. Follow @CityofSIB on Facebook and Twitter to stay connected.

We were fortunate that Hurricane Dorian missed us, but that does not mean you should let your guard down. Hurricane season does not officially end until November 30, and as you all know, anything can happen. We had an extended preparation period for Dorian, but next time, we might not be as lucky. Heed the warning of what happened in the Bahamas. Though our city's construction has greatly improved, we might still experience significant impacts. From loss of electricity and running water to inoperable sewage and major flooding, our city's infrastructure could be vulnerable in the event of a strong hurricane.

It is important to keep your hurricane supplies replenished and your evacuation plans upto-date. If there is an evacuation order for our city, evacuate. Our top priority is the safety of all residents and visitors.

A Message from the City Manager

m T}$ he filing of the 2019-2020 fiscal year budget represents my 14th budget as your City Manager. Our assessed value has increased almost \$448 million from last year, and we have a budget that keeps the same millage rate at 2.2 mils per \$1,000 of assessed value. This resulted in an unprecedented third year that our City has proposed a tax rate below the roll back rate. For the next few years, our revenue from growth of our tax base will need to be directed to the Capital Fund expenditures for transportation and pedestrian safety initiatives, utility undergrounding, storm drainage, facilities, and new park development projects. Our City's assessed property tax value will continue to increase over the next three to five fiscal years as the new construction continues on a much slower pace than previous years.

The Police Department, under Chief Snyder's first full year, continued its push to focus on pedestrian and vehicular safety along Collins Avenue. There has been a tremendous effort in education, warnings to motorists and pedestrians alike, and summons issued. Other projects include the Gateway Park interior buildout, which is now underway and will be completed in 2020. This facility will house our senior programs, among other activities. The City continues its utility undergrounding project with the installation of decorative streetlights throughout Collins Avenue, and Florida Power & Light



authorized electrical contractors are in the process of wiring the new system along Collins Avenue and the Atlantic Boulevard corridor.

Plans for the pedestrian bridge over Collins Avenue at 180 Street are well underway and expected to be completed and out to bid by the end of this calendar year. We recently obtained the necessary easements to commence planning and design of the pedestrian bridge over Collins Avenue at 174 Street to Samson Oceanfront Park. We have been awarded grant funding through the state of Florida for both of these bridges, thanks to the help of our State representatives.

The Public Art Trust Fund total budget is \$695,628, an increase of \$62,447 from the prior year. With the Public Arts Advisory Committee's creation of a multi-phased public art plan under parameters that were jointly established with the Commission, this Fund becomes an important asset. The PAAC's first effort, the creation of a meditation garden located in the western area of Town Center Park, will utilize this fund as well as possible community funding.

The Capital Improvement Program concentrates on the development of parks, infrastructure, and rehabilitation of our facilities including major road resurfacing, infrastructure upgrades, and expansion. The City has been successful in leveraging City dollars to obtain grant awards and legislative appropriations for some capital projects and continues

to seek these where possible. Significant projects include \$7 million for the interior build out of Gateway Park, \$2.5 million to rebuild the Golden Shores Stormwater pump station, an additional \$1 million for the pedestrian bridge at the Government Center, and \$1 million added to the utility undergrounding project.

The 2019-20 Fiscal Year Budget is a financial plan that provides a full scope of high quality municipal services. This budget provides the required resources for us to complete all the great parks, facilities, infrastructure, and other amenities that make our community so desirable.

I want to express my thanks to our Mayor and Commissioners for their input and support throughout the year. The work of our dedicated department heads and staff does not go unnoticed or underappreciated. While it is a group that brings the budget together, I would be remiss not to point out our dedicated, hard-working Finance Department, under the leadership of Tiffany Neely. The City continues to maintain fiscal strength and stability. This budget enables the City of Sunny Isles Beach to continue its quality of life as a thriving and safe community that cherishes its location, unites in its diversity and evolves to meet the continuous challenges that greet us every day.

recently heard about the great actions some of our condominiums and businesses are taking to improve our community and environment. With all of the ecological challenges we are facing today, this is excellent news to hear and to share.

A multifamily building in SIB that is adjacent to several hundred feet of public space, has officially removed glyphosate from usage in lawn maintenance and landscaping on its common elements and area properties. Glyphosate is a prevalent, yet contentious herbicide found in weed killers, such as Roundup. The negative effects of glyphosate are well documented and known. And discontinuing the use of harmful products with glyphosate, such as Roundup, is one important step that some are taking to seek solutions to our environmental issues.

This is a great example of how our residents work together to protect the local environment. Eliminating the use of products with glyphosate protects the health and safety of maintenance workers by reducing their risk of exposure, as well as our community as a whole by also minimizing the chemicals in our environment that we all share.

It's a win-win for all. Let this decision to quit using products with glyphosate serve as a call to action for the rest of our condominium associations and homeowners. This is one positive narrative that I hope all other buildings in our city will follow. Collectively, we can work to make our community the best it can be. Behind the Scenes with the Building Department: Flood Protection



The City of Sunny Isles Beach is particularly susceptible to flooding from major rain events and storm surge. SIB lies close to sea level and its underground water supply is just below the ground surface. Therefore, major rain events sometimes leave rainwater nowhere to drain, causing occasional flooding. Your property may be high enough that it has not been flooded during recent storms, however, it can still be flooded in the event of a worse future storm. Now is the time to be prepared and protect yourself and your property.

Contact the Building Department at 305.947.2150 to obtain information on City-offered flood services including map determinations, copies of elevation certificates, and recommendations on possible improvements to protect your home from flooding.

Maintain drains, ditches, and streams clear of debris. Report illegal dumping at 305.792.1711.

Talk to your insurance agent about obtaining flood insurance.

Be aware of flood warning notices issued by the National Weather Service.

Shut off your gas and electricity and move valuable content to higher places.
