#### **Changes to Our Meeting Procedures**

You may have noticed that our commission meetings are structured differently now. Commission meetings take place on the third Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m., with the exception of December when there is no meeting. In the past, all items were addressed at Thursday night meetings. Now, we hear all discussion items and special presentations at a 3:00 p.m. workshop on the third Thursday, during which no voting or public discussion takes place. We reconvene at 6:30 p.m. to address city business that requires a vote and for which there is public comment.

In addition, we have introduced an agenda workshop at 10:00 a.m. on the Tuesday before the commission meeting. As a publicly noticed meeting, staff and commissioners are able to openly discuss the upcoming agenda items, which streamlines the commission meeting two days later. As for the Thursday 3:00 p.m., although none of the items require an immediate vote, some may become items that are voted during the 6:30 p.m. meeting.

Let's take the E-Scooters ordinance as an example. E-Scooters have become a major nuisance and safety concern in SIB.

As part of the new procedures, commissioners' deadlines for submitting discussion/agenda items was October 6, 2023. Three elected officials timely submitted their ideas, research, and/or perspective for discussion at the 3:00 p.m. workshop.



The city attorney then drafted an ordinance addressing the desired goals for this issue and provided it to the commission by October 13. The commission discussed the proposed ordinance at the 3:00 p.m. workshop on Thursday October 19, where some amendments were made. With the commission's consensus, the E-Scooter ordinance was brought forward as an add-on item and was voted favorably on first reading at the 6:30 p.m. meeting. The second reading vote will be held at the November meeting.

Both the Tuesday and Thursday workshops, along with all commission meetings, are open to the public. I hope to see you there.

#### **Utilizing Available Resources**

In March of this year, I wrote about resources offered by Miami-Dade County for condominium owners in need of assistance with their special assessment for the 40-year recertification, as well as resources to help home buyers. I'd like to remind our residents that these resources are still available. Additionally, I know a resident who applied for the Condo Special Assessment Program and received approval for a 0% interest loan for a 40-year term. Here is a brief description of the program:

### Miami-Dade County Condominium Special Assessment Program:

This program assists owner-occupied condominium homeowners with limited finances and addresses special assessment requirements associated with repairs due to recertification. Surtax funds will be in the form of a loan at zero interest rate and a household income of up to 140% of the Area Median Income. The monthly payment for moderate-income families will be calculated at a 0% interest rate for 40 years.

#### **SIBPD Earns Prestigious Accreditation**

The Sunny Isles Beach Police Department (SIBPD) achieved a significant milestone last month by earning "Accreditation Status" from the Florida Commission for Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA). The esteemed recognition highlights the department's commitment to ensuring its personnel stay updated and compliant with the latest trends in law enforcement.

The journey to accreditation began in July 2022 when they signed an agreement with CFA to be in compliance within twenty-four months, SIBPD did it in just fourteen months. This past August a team of independent assessors conducted a comprehensive evaluation of all aspects of SIBPD. This assessment encompassed a thorough review of the department's policies, procedures, operations, and training protocols. The results of this assessment were nothing short of outstanding, without any non-compliance issues.

The accreditation reinforces the department's ability to prevent and manage criminal activities while enhancing the efficiency and effectiveness of law enforcement services provided to the community. The result is a safer and more secure environment for all residents and visitors.

### Miami-Dade Transit Bus Routes Changing

Starting on Monday, November 13, major changes are coming to Miami-Dade County's Metrobus routes, as part of their new Better Bus SHIFTS initiative. These changes will impact bus routes in Sunny Isles Beach.

Here are the key modifications from Miami-Dade Transit in our area:

- Route E will be discontinued, with the current service area now being covered by routes 75 and 100.
- Route S will also be discontinued, with the current service area shifting to route 100.
- Route H will be discontinued, with the current service area being taken over by route 75.
- 120 Beach Max will be renumbered as route 100.

As a result, route 75 will provide transportation to Haulover Park, while route 100 will specifically cater to riders along Collins Avenue to and from Aventura Mall. These changes will have direct

impact on residents who previously relied on Miami-Dade Transit services in the inner part of the city, west of Collins Avenue.

But don't worry, we'll still get you where you need to go. The SIBshuttle is a free and convenient ride around Sunny Isles Beach and neighboring cities. You can hop on various stops throughout the city, and at major transit hubs like Intracoastal Mall, Aventura Mall and Hallandale Fire Station. Use the SIBshuttle to connect to the streamlined Metrobus for more efficient trips to destinations all throughout Miami-Dade County.
